Featured Member of the Month - David Brian Williams

In a career spanning prestigious institutions and influential roles, **Dr. David Brian Williams** stands as a luminary in music technology and higher education. Currently serving as the Emeritus Professor of Music and Arts Technology at Illinois State University, Dr. Williams has left an indelible mark on the landscape of music education and research.

A distinguished academic, Dr. Williams holds degrees in music education and music theory and composition (BMEd and MM) from Northwestern State University of Louisiana. His academic journey culminated in a PhD in Systematic Musicology from the University of Washington. Throughout his illustrious career, he has contributed significantly to the field, holding faculty, research, and administrative positions at esteemed institutions such as the University of Guam, University of Washington, Southwest Regional Laboratory for Education Research and Development, California State University at Los Angeles, Illinois State University, and Boston University.

Dr. Williams' passion lies in the intersection of music education and research, music psychology, and music and arts technology. Notably, his latest edition of "Experiencing Music Technology," with co-author Peter Webster, is reshaping music education, championing independent and creative thinking.

His influence extends beyond academia, as Dr. Williams has served on the boards of key organizations in the field, including NAfME, CMS, IMEA and CMEA, ATMI, and TI:ME. His scholarly contributions



have found a home in various music research and education journals, solidifying his reputation as a thought leader in the industry.

As a composer, Dr. Williams has co-created multimedia performance works, including "Grassroots 2008 and 2012," in collaboration with Tayloe Harding. These performances, with national acclaim, showcase his innovative approach to combining music and technology.

Beyond his professional endeavors, Dr. Williams, along with his wife Kay, remains actively engaged in the Bloomington, Illinois community as woodwind players. Their commitment to both art and community further underscores the multifaceted nature of Dr. Williams' impact, making him a distinguished figure in the world of music technology and higher education.
